| 1066 | This item was brought forward. Speeding – Cllr Lomer-Wood informed the Council that she had sent the results and analysis from the household survey, aimed to gauge how residents are affected by speeding traffic, the anti-social hours of HGV's travelling through the village and the safety of the existing footway, to the County Council Minister for Highways. As yet no response had been received. Much discussion took place on the concerning matter of speeding. Reference was made to Walcote, a small village on the A427 in Leicestershire which had worked with Leicestershire Police and County Highways to trial average speed cameras through the village. This had proved to be very successful. County Cllr Matthews advised that the timing for any consultation with Northants Highways may not be appropriate for the next 6 months whilst the new North Northants Authority is being formed. The Council agreed that in the meantime it would contact Northants Police to request attendance at its next meeting to discuss options and to draw up a list of possible traffic calming measures through the village as well as looking at Walcote's methodology in order that a robust argument for speed reduction can be put forward to the new Authority. Village Cycle Way and Footpaths – County Cllr Matthews informed the Council that works to extend the footway in the village had been scheduled subject to funding.
